Sgt. Peppers Lonely Heart Club Show took place on the evening of Friday 19th November 2010. I think it was a delight to watch and the band gave a very convincing representation of the Beatles themselves. They looked like them, spoke like them and had the just the same mannerisms. I think the man that played "Paul McCartney" was especially convincing in his demeanour and still managed to sing like him and hit the notes during movement.

With the show consisting of two main parts, the first being Sgt. Pepper songs, followed by an interval lasting around fifteen(15) minutes and the second part being well-known Beatles songs. Along with a solo-performance by "Paul McCartney" singing '*Blackbird*'.

The song written by John Lennon – *Strawberry Fields* was performed brilliantly and almost faultless. The backing music was good and well represented with the extra percussion. This also applied to '*Come together*'.

The band themselves expressed a lot of energy towards the audience and at one point the audience were even asked to stand and dance to the music. I think this reflects enjoyment of the whole scene being created and offloads a load of positivity back onto the band. This boosted their morale and allowed them to finish the show off in an uplifting way with the audience highly enjoying themselves.

The song chosen as the finale to the show was '*Twist and Shout*' and a great finish to the show it was too! A very professional performance, my overall feeling of the show was one of happiness and so I would say the band delivered a well constructed tribute to the Beatles.
